Januay 1989 in El Progreso, Honduras. Member of the Society of Jesus (S.J.) – a religious congregation of the Catholic Curch – since 1978.

RADIO PROGRESO

A local, independent radio station which has existed for over 50 years, and is part of the Catholic Radio Network. The station reaches 1,5 million listeners.

It is a popular radio that transmits music and entertainment, but known for its independent, progressive utterances against social injustice in Honduras. The station was shut down by the military around the time of the coup in 2009, and has been occupied several times since.

Two Radio Progreso team members, have been brutally murdered - Carlos Mejia in april 2014 and Nery Jeremías Orellada in July 2011. In 2014 Melo stated that 16 of ERIC/Radio Progreso employees, including Mejia, have received several death threats after 2009.

ERIC (Equipo de Reflexion, Investigacion y Comunicación)

Is a center for social analysis, research and communication concerning social and political issues in Honduras, founded in 1980. The work encompasses grassroots radio programming, human rights training programs; community organising and empowerment and formation of leadership committed to social change, and aiding migrant families.

Today Padre Melo is the director. In 2002 he established a Human Rights Department within ERIC. The organisation works closely with Radio Progreso.

SHORT FACTS HONDURAS

Population: 8 423 917

Spanish speaking republic in Central America.

Capital: Tegucigalpa. Borders to El Salvador, Nicaragua and Guatemala.

Government: Juan Orlando Hernández is the current President of Honduras (since January

2014), and leader of the conservative National Party of Honduras.

GDP: 17,3 mill USD

The political landscape has traditionally been divided in two, between the conservative National Party and the Liberals, and has for a long period been ruled by military juntas. After the 2009 Hondurian coup d'etat that deposed the president Zelaya, the political violence increased in strength. The country is characterized by high unemployment, noticeable in the form of social instability. 59% of the population live below the poverty line, and 36.2% live in extreme poverty.

Two of Honduras' cities are on the list of the world's most dangerous, Tegucigalpa and San Pedro Sula. The latter has currently the highest homicide rate in the world; 173 per 100 000 inhabitants.
